FROM PASTOR CHRIS

Election season is closing in on us. We may or may not know what the role is of a church/congregation and a pastor when it comes to political activity. Congregations and pastors are bound by laws that govern not-for-profit tax-exempt organizations. What this means is there are things as a congregation and as a pastor we can and cannot do if we want to continue as a tax-exempt not-for-profit 501c(3) organization. For example:

We can:

- *Provide voter guides and encourage people to vote
- *Have dialogues and debates about the pros and cons of legislation
- *Provide equal opportunity for speeches

We cannot:

- Make direct endorsement of a candidate
- Make contributions to candidates or campaigns
- Have activities or speeches that would clearly favor one candidate over another



As a church and as a pastor we have a responsibility to adhere to these rules and regulations which were enacted 70 years ago in 1954 when Congress amended the Internal Revenue Code to impose limits on the political activities of religious groups and certain tax-exempt nonprofit organizations.

Please note - There are congregations and pastors who break these rules unintentionally out of ignorance or intentionally because they disrespect the law.

To reiterate:

As a pastor I cannot endorse a candidate from the pulpit or in social media.

As a pastor I can preach from the pulpit and teach the morals and ethics of Jesus's sayings and teaching as reminders to consider when we are discerning which candidates, policies and legislation best aligns with our calling as followers of Jesus.

As a person, not as a pastor I can (like any private citizen) endorse and support candidates, polices and legislation.

If you are interested in my thoughts about candidates, policies or legislation, I'm willing to share my thoughts, but I would do so as my personal opinion not as a pastor.

I will close with the familiar words of Jesus, "Love your neighbor as yourself". As we move ever closer to election day may this central teaching of Jesus be a steadfast reminder of his call to us in all aspects of our thinking and actions. May it serve as a benchmark as we reflect and evaluate candidates, polices and legislation.

We will continue to pray this prayer on Sundays (as we have been) through the election season: Almighty God, we lift before you all who govern this state and nation and those who will be elected to do so in the future. May those who hold power understand that it is a trust from you to be used, not for personal glory or profit, but for the service of the people. Drive from us cynicism, selfishness and corruption; grant in your mercy just and honest government and leaders and give us grace to live together in unity and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
