FROM PASTOR CHRIS

As we move into this new calendar year not knowing what lays ahead it may be helpful to look back. Looking back into history can bring perspective to the present. One way to do this is to look to notable people from the past who shared their thoughts about life and the future.

Alfred, Lord Tennyson (1809-1892) wrote: A New Year's Poem

Ring out, wild bells, to the wild sky, The flying cloud, the frosty light; The year is dying in the night; Ring out, wild bells, and let him die.

Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow; The year is going, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true.

Ring out the grief that saps the mind, For those that here we see no more; Ring out the feud of rich and poor, Ring in redress to all mankind.

Ring out a slowly dying cause, And ancient forms of party strife; Ring in the nobler modes of life, With sweeter manners, purer laws.

Ring out the want, the care, the sin, The faithless coldness of the times; Ring out, ring out my mournful rimes But ring the fuller minstrel in.

Ring out false pride in place and blood, The civic slander and the spite; Ring in the love of truth and right, Ring in the common love of good.

Ring out old shapes of foul disease; Ring out the narrowing lust of gold; Ring out the thousand wars of old, Ring in the thousand years of peace. Ring in the valiant man and free, The larger heart, the kindlier hand; Ring out the darkness of the land, Ring in the Christ that is to be.

One who lived about 700 years before Tennyson, Francis of Assisi wrote not a poem but a prayer: Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Where there is hatred, let us sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. Grant that we may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen Jesus who lived on this earth about 1100 years before Francis of Assisi said: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you....Do to others as you would have them do to you." Luke 6:27-28, 31

As we live into this New Year, not knowing what lays ahead these are a few perspectives from people of the past that can serve to shape our lives in the present and into the future.

May God who is the author of life and time guide our hearts and minds.


